McRae-Hay Lake-Roadside collection will begin May 2nd and end October 17th.

Waste Collection Calendar – Please refer to the Waste Collection Calendar for any changes in the waste collection schedule. The calendar is on the website and was mailed with the Interim tax bills.

**The time of your roadside pick-up could be anytime between 7:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. on your scheduled day. **

Private Waste Bins Please be advised as per By-Law # 16-517 subsection 4.8 "Private bins must be located on private property outside of the obvious road allowance". Residents are also required as per subsection 4.7 to "remove the waste from these bins on the day of collection, put the waste in suitable garbage bags and place it at the side of the nearest township maintained road or public highway."

Please note that any person deemed by the By-Law Enforcement Officer to be in contravention of the By-Law may be subject to penalties outlined in By-Law 16-517. Waste containers that are not manufactured for the purpose of waste, such as freezers are not permitted.

Building/Septic

Please be advised that revisions were made to the Schedule of Fees By-Law #17-524 that included an additional fee that will be applied to property owners that start construction prior to a building permit being applied for or issued. The cost of the fees will be "Equal to the permit fee or a minimum of \$100.00." A copy of the Schedule of Fees By-Law #17-524 is available on the Township website or at the Township Office.

A Building Permit is required for the construction of any free-standing structure larger than 10 square meters (108 sq./ft.). A structure that is being attached to any other structure requires a permit regardless of size.

Budget

On April 20, 2017, the 2017 was approved; as a result, the total tax increase is less than 0.5%. In 2016, all properties in the province have been re-assessed by Assessment Municipal Property Corporation (MPAC). Property Assessment Notice informing you of your Current Value Assessment was mailed to you late 2016; as a result of this re-assessment there has been an overall property assessment decrease in South Algonquin. This assessment decrease combined with increased policing costs, other levies to be paid to the province and operational expenses has resulted in the tax increase. The project plans being developed in accordance with the 2017 budget include: continued road and drainage improvements, landfill management and long-term planning, site plan development for Aylen Lake boat launch and Centennial Park and equipment replacement. A copy of the 2017 Budget Summary and a detailed presentation are available on website www.southalgonquin.ca. installment for the interim billing is due May 31, 2017. The final tax bill for 2017 will be sent out in early August with due dates of August 31, 2017 and October 31, 2017.

Animal Control

Dog Tags - Residents of the Township of South Algonquin who own or harbour dogs are required by BY-LAW #12-430 to purchase a DOG TAG for each animal they are responsible for. Dog Tags purchased are valid for the lifetime of your dog. Tags are available at the Municipal Office for \$10.00. Replacement tags are \$5.00.

Please be a Considerate and Responsible Dog Owner and keep dogs on a leash and in control by a competent person when off your property. They are to be deterred from running on the private property of other residents.

REMINDER:

IF A CAPTURED DOG IS WEARING A DOG TAG AN ATTEMPT WILL BE MADE TO RETURN THE DOG TO IT'S OWNER ONCE. IF IT IS NOT WEARING A TAG, IT WILL BE TAKEN TO THE KENNEL FACILITY IN BONNECHERE VALLEY. Fees to have a dog released from this facility can range between \$200.00 to \$300.00, plus any incurred costs. These fees must be paid at the Township Office prior to the release of the animal.
