## Household Waste Collection Areas

**TUESDAYS:** Old 127, Hwy. 127 from the Old 127 south to the Sabine Ward including McGuey Rd, McKenzie Lake Rd area, returning north on Hwy 127 to Old 127.

**WEDNESDAYS:** The Village of Madawaska, Hwy 60 to the eastern boundary of the Township including Spectacle Lake Rd, Major Lake Rd & McCauley Lake Rd, Hwy 523 to the southern boundary of the Township. From 2:00 pm to 3:00 pm the waste collection truck will be located at the Aylen Lake Boat Launch, 1706 Aylen Lake Rd. as long as the weather permits then it will be moved to the corner of Aylen Lake Rd and North Aylen Lake Rd..

**THURSDAYS:** Hwy. 60 from the Village of Madawaska's western boundary to Hwy 127, south on Hwy 127 to Old 127/Hwy 127, returning north on Hwy 127 to Hwy 60, west on Hwy 60 to Whitney then the Village of Whitney including Hwy 60 to the western boundary of the Township, returning east on Hwy 60 to Madawaska.

## BLUE BOX ITEMS NOW ACCEPTED AT BOTH LANDFILL SITES

Property owners can dispose of these items at the landfill site. Items will not be recycled when picked up by the waste collection truck. See the reverse side for the list of acceptable items



## Notice to Residents

- Please place household waste at the roadside on the scheduled day of collection. This will help deter birds and animals. (Property owners are responsible for picking up any waste that may get scattered along the roadside by birds and animals). The time of your roadside pick-up could be anytime between 7:00 am to 3:00 pm on your scheduled day.

- Residents are required to place household waste in garbage bags. Approved removable containers are permitted providing the household waste is in garbage bags (freezers or permanent containers are not acceptable).
- Residents, who store household waste in private bins or boxes will be required to remove the waste from these bins on the day of collection, put the waste in garbage bags and place them at the side of the

nearest Township maintained road or public highway. Private bins must be located on private property outside of the obvious road allowance.

## TRANSPORTING WASTE

- Residents are required to secure and cover loads to avoid debris from falling off onto municipal roads and highways.

**AT THE LANDFILL SITE, WE RECYCLE, REDUCE, REUSE**  
*Please see the Landfill Site Attendant prior to depositing material to ensure the proper location.*

**ELECTRONICS**

Microwaves, all small kitchen appliances, lamps, vacuums, laptops, cell phones, televisions, drills, electronic toys.

**ALUMINUM**

Please help by making sure deposited items are made from aluminum. Aluminum is not magnetic (for example soft drink cans and cat food cans).

**LARGE APPLIANCES**

All appliances are accepted. Please place fridges and freezers in a normal standing position and latching or locking doors must be removed.

**TIRES**

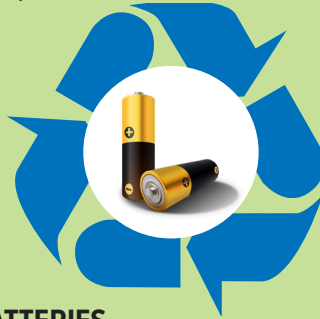
Tires on rims are accepted.

**STEEL**

All types of steel are accepted. This includes clean food cans/clean

**WOOD:**

Only brush, unpainted or untreated wood.



**BATTERIES**

Most types of batteries (not car batteries) are accepted at both landfill sites. Please sort your batteries and place in the appropriate battery bin. Car batteries can be disposed at our annual Household Hazardous Waste Day.

Collection kits for batteries weighing under 5 kg are also available at the municipal office.

**SHREDDING:**

Most waste that is not hazardous, household, clean wood, reusable or recyclable (no food or food packaging).

**FURNITURE**

Fabric-covered furniture and mattresses..unpainted or untreated wood.

*Each landfill site has a reuse area where useful items can be deposited or taken home.*

**WASTE DISPOSAL AND FEES**

Only waste generated from within the geographic boundaries of the Township of South Algonquin shall be deposited in the landfill site. Proof of civic address or Demolition Permit must be provided.

Only domestic, construction and demolition waste, scrap metal/appliances and tires are accepted for disposal at the landfill sites. Hazardous waste, septic waste and liquid industrial waste are not accepted.

**NEW WASTE DISPOSAL FEES** Proof of demolition permit or civic address number must be provided.

Brush, Wood Chips Half Ton Truck/Van with/without Small Trailer if brought in by resident. **NO CHARGE**

Tires on or off Rims **NO CHARGE**

Mattresses, box springs and fabric covered furniture with metal frames (couches, loveseats, sofa chairs etc.) **\$10/piece**

Fiber Glass/Wood Boats/Vessels Aluminum boats exempt **\$5/foot**

**LANDFILL SITE ENTRY DURING NON-OPERATION HOURS**

First entry (pre-approval required) **\$100 each**

Additional same day entry (from time of first entry to last) **\$50/hr**

**CONSTRUCTION/DEMOLITION WASTE** (Including shingles)

Passenger Vehicles - Car, Van, SUV, Half Ton Truck/Van, Small Trailer **Sorted \$5 / Unsorted \$20\***

Utility Trailer Single Axle **Sorted \$20 / Unsorted \$80**

Utility Trailer Tandem Axle **Sorted \$25 / Unsorted \$100**

Commercial Trailer Single Axle **Sorted \$30 / Unsorted \$120**

Commercial Trailer Tandem Axle **Sorted \$35 / Unsorted \$140**

Single Axle Dump Truck **Sorted \$50 / Unsorted \$200**

Tandem Dump Truck **Sorted \$80 / Unsorted \$320**

Triaxle Dump Truck **Sorted \$120 / Unsorted \$500**

Contaminated Soil (pre-approval required) **\$30/tonne plus cost recovery**

**Please Note**

*\*Residents are exempt from this fee if it is brought in by the resident.*

**NOTICE TO RESIDENTS**

No person shall throw, place or deposit any type of waste on any roadway, highway or bridge or any municipally owned property that is outside of the limits of the Landfill Sites as per By-Law 16-517. This also includes stove ashes.



**ACCEPTABLE ITEMS**



**RECYCLE RIGHT:** These items are acceptable in your recycling bin. Ensure all items are **EMPTY AND CLEAN**.



**PLASTICS**

**WHAT** EMPTY AND CLEAN Plastic Bottles, Containers and Cups



**GLASS**

**WHAT** EMPTY AND CLEAN Bottles and Jars (All Colors)



**CARTONS**

**WHAT** EMPTY AND CLEAN Boxed Food and Beverage Cartons, Paper Cups



**METAL**

**WHAT** EMPTY AND CLEAN Aluminum and Steel Cans, Aluminum Foil



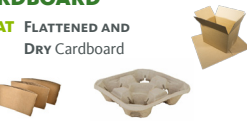
**PAPER**

**WHAT** Newspaper, Magazines, Printed Paper and Shredded Paper  
**HOW** Shredded paper in a paper bag. This is the only item that should be bagged



**CARDBOARD**

**WHAT** FLATTENED AND DRY Cardboard



**UNACCEPTABLE ITEMS** - These items are NOT accepted with your recycling and require alternative handling.



Organic, kitchen, yard and animal waste.



Hazardous waste like paint, gas or aerosol cans, sharp objects, electronics and batteries.



Scrap metal, wires and cables, home and construction waste.



Napkins, paper towels and food soiled cardboard.



Styrofoam™ packaging materials and takeout food/beverage containers.



Textiles, housewares, windows, ceramics, and other reusable items.



Large plastic products like bins or trays, pouches, plastic bags, and toys.



Diapers and personal hygiene products.
